Complete Rose Name, eg. Peace, Mister Lincoln, etc. You must have this.

Clearly write your Name and Address, or for a quick solution, bring address labels to stick to the tag.

This Show does not require an Exhibitor's Number—leave this blank

The awards are where the judges will either mark with a pen or hole-punch

Be sure to fill out the entire bottom half of your entry tag the same as the top. This portion of the tag is used to tabulate the results.

Final Note:
The tag is perforated and will be folded to conceal the identity of the entrant for judging. Once you have filled out your entries completely, take them to the classification table, where the tags will be folded along the seam, sealed with the flap, and placed on the proper table for judging. If the tag is not filled out properly, your entry may be disqualified. If you need additional help with your entry, visit the novice table at the show.

NOTE: Denver Rose Society rose shows are governed by the standard rules, regulations, and guidelines of the American Rose Society. If you plan to enter exhibits in the areas of horticulture, photography, or floral design, read the guidelines in the Show Schedule. Your entry could be disqualified because of incomplete or inaccurate information on the show tag or by placing the specimen in the incorrect category. This example contains the basic format of the rose show tag.
